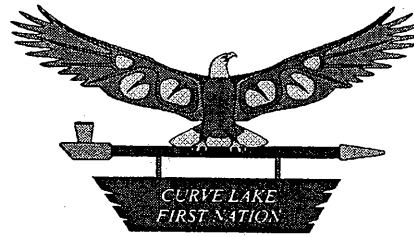

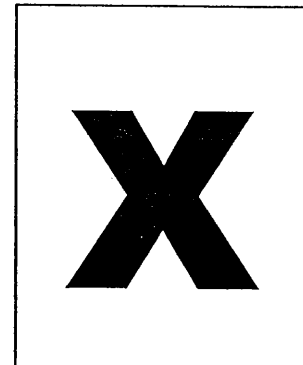

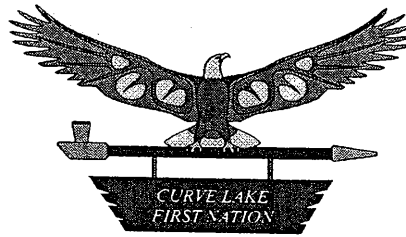

NATIVES WHO ARE REGISTERED STATUS INDIANS UNDER THE INDIAN ACT AND BELONG TO ANOTHER FIRST NATION ARE ENTITLED TO BE TRANSFERRED TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION IF THE MAJORITY OF CURVE LAKE ELIGIBLE VOTERS, VOTE TO ACCEPT THEM AS MEMBERS.

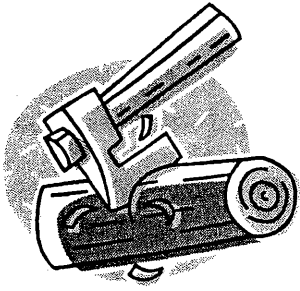
Attention Curve Lake First Nation Members

At the most recent Council Meeting held May 15, 2006, the moratorium on Curve Lake First Nation members constructing cabins on Fox Island was lifted subject to applicants meeting the provisions of the draft by-law. Those who had previously applied to Council for permission to build and whose applications had been put on hold while a by-law was being drafted for implementation are being notified of this change in writing.

While the by-law has been drafted and approved-in-principle by Council, certain administrative processes still have to be confirmed. Once these are developed and ready to be put in place, **Council is committed to proceeding with approval of the Cabin By-Law under the provisions of the Indian Act.** Rather than hold up building, Council is prepared to consider approving construction interim to its passage.

In order for one to get approval and to be added to Schedule "B" of the by-law when the by-law is implemented one would have to meet the provisions of the by-law which will allow for the grand-fathering of an existing cabin. If any First Nation member, eighteen years of age or older, and who does not own an existing cabin on Fox Island is interested in getting approval to build they are urged to make themselves familiar with the draft by-law and its provisions. A copy can be picked up at the Reception desk in the Curve Lake Administration Office.

In order to get Council approval, applicants must contact Darryl Rose, a member of the Rights and Resources Committee, at 657-3781. He is prepared to work with members to get the Rights and Resources Committee recommendation to Council before the end of the current Council term. The site plan, cabin plan, siting of an outhouse and dockage could be considered for recommendation to Council at the next Rights and Resources Committee meeting scheduled for June 7, 2006.

WHEN: Saturday, May 27th & Sunday May 28th, 2006

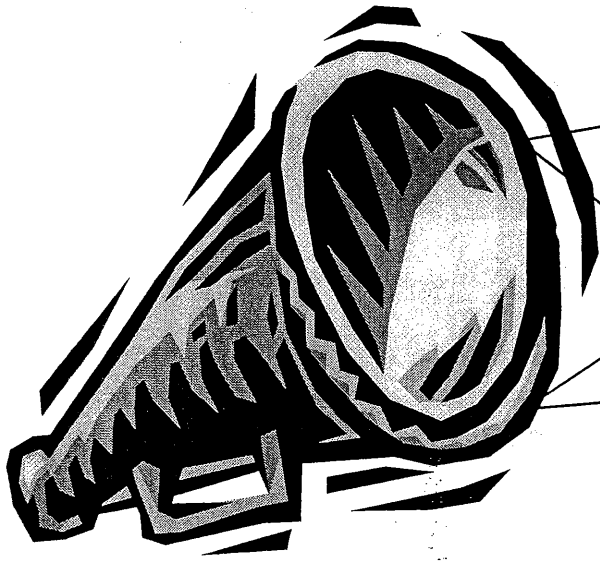
Limit: Two ½ ton loads per household. The wood is **NOT** to be removed
