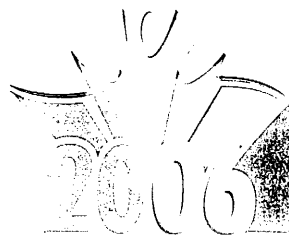

## Job Opportunities for the 2006 Census

Statistics Canada conducts a national census once every five years. On Tuesday, May 16, more than 32.5 million people in 12.7 million households across Canada will "count themselves in" as part of the 2006 Census.

Statistics Canada will be hiring staff for full-time temporary census positions starting early in 2006. These are not office jobs - extensive outdoor work in a variety of neighbourhoods and communities is required. The job also includes frequent interaction with members of your community and other First Nations.

In Ontario alone, Statistics Canada needs to hire hundreds of people to enumerate First Nation communities.

### Census Crew Leader Positions (\$15.62 per hour):

A Crew Leader is a supervisor responsible for all activities related to enumeration of a geographical area referred to as a crew leader district. The job of a Crew Leader is to train, lead and supervise a team of approximately 4 to 8 enumerators in conducting the enumeration for the Census. The job may also require the recruitment and selection of enumerators.

The importance of the Crew Leader's role cannot be overemphasized. Crew Leaders are responsible for the organization and successful completion of all assigned work in their own district. These districts can be made up of several nearby communities. The information gathered by Crew Leaders and their teams is used in important long-term planning that will affect all Aboriginal people living in Canada.

Each Crew Leader assignment takes between eleven to seventeen weeks to complete.

### Census Enumerator Positions (\$11.88 per hour):

An Enumerator will have various census responsibilities in one or more assigned areas referred to as "collection units." The job requires going door-to-door and canvassing all dwellings to complete a census questionnaire. Enumerators may work on one or several communities.

All candidates will have to successfully complete a screening, written test, oral interview, and reference check, administered by Statistics Canada. In addition, all candidates will have to pass a security clearance, which may include the submission of fingerprints.

Since September 2005, Susie and Zeke Taylor have been legally defending the right of Dennis Taylor to live with his family and friends in Curve Lake instead of in Calgary, Alberta with a step-family. Dennis is the son of Zeke Taylor and the late Lana Taylor, brother of Derrick and David Taylor and the grandson of Violet Taylor and Susie Taylor.

Mounting legal costs from having to retain lawyers in Ontario and Alberta plus an Ontario Court of Appeal appearance in January 2006 has almost depleted our financial resources.

In the upcoming months, Dennis's family and extended family will be hosting a number of fundraising events to ensure that we will be able to continue to legally defend Dennis's right to live in the community where he was born and raised for six of the eight years of his life.

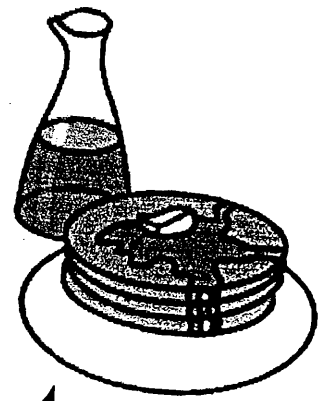
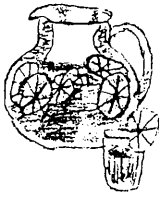
