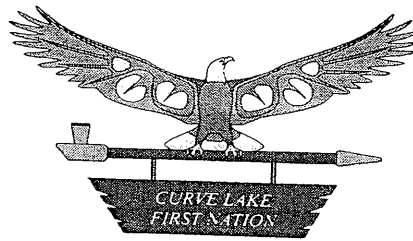

MEMBERSHIP TRANSFER

NATIVES WHO ARE REGISTERED STATUS INDIANS UNDER THE INDIAN ACT AND BELONG TO ANOTHER FIRST NATION ARE ENTITLED TO BE TRANSFERRED TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION IF THE MAJORITY OF CURVE LAKE ELIGIBLE VOTERS, VOTE TO ACCEPT THEM AS MEMBERS.

WE HAVE TWO REQUESTS:

1. **MICHAEL JAMES CONWAY**

REQUESTS TRANSFER FROM HENVEY INLET FIRST NATION TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION.

2. **BRIDGET MISSABIE**

REQUEST TRANSFER FROM MISSISSAUGA #8 FIRST NATION TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION.

Attached are letters from the above requesting a transfer. Please review the letters concerning the request.

All eligible voters have the option to vote members from other First Nations into Curve Lake First Nation. Transfers are only voted on during the Curve Lake First Nation's General Election.

Dear Curve Lake Community Members,

I am writing to ask for support to become an active member of Curve Lake First Nation. My name is Bridget Missabie and I am currently a member of Mississauga #8 near Blind River. I have never known what a community was until I moved here. My mother grew up in foster care and had no ties to the Mississauga #8 community; I also have no ties to that community. When I was born, my mother moved to Toronto to become gainfully employed and to find a place for us to live. I moved to Toronto with her once she had settled in and that is where I grew up. For anyone who has lived in the city for any length of time, you would know that the city is a fairly cold and unfriendly place to be.

I moved to Curve Lake approximately three years ago and reside with Doug Taylor and his son, Denell. Since we've been here we have started a business, D & D Plumbing, that serves the community and it is our hope that in time we will hire an apprentice from the community.
