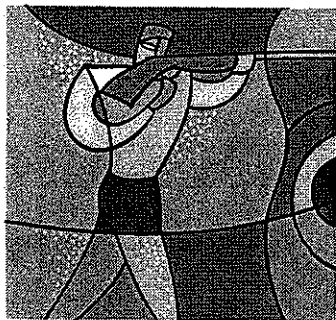

# Community Members

Dear Community Members.

These are some helpful hints provided to you from the Public Works Department in regards to how we should be recycling in Curve Lake.

1. Pink meat trays are currently not recyclable; you may dispose of these in your regular household garbage.
2. Coffee cups such as Tim Hortons are currently not recyclable; you may dispose of these in your regular household garbage.
3. Plastic and cardboard should be separated. Example: a case of pop should be separated into its plastic and cardboard components and recycled individually.
4. Milk cartons, creamer cartons and such are not cardboard and should be put out on Fridays rather than Wednesday or dropped off directly at the Waste Transfer Station
5. Newspapers are to be put out on Fridays or dropped off at Waste Transfer Station.

## **SCHEDULE "B"**

### **MATERIALS TO BE COLLECTED FOR RECYCLING FROM CURBSIDE AND DEPOT LOCATIONS AT CURVE LAKE FIRST NATIONS**

#### **CURBSIDE COLLECTION**

##### **Steel & Aluminum Cans**

Includes all metal food and beverage containers. Please remove lids on steel cans, place inside can and pinch closed.

##### **Metal Foil**

Includes clean aluminum foil, pie plates and take-out food trays. (Please ball foil)

##### **Clear & Coloured Glass Bottles & Jugs**

Includes clear and coloured glass food and beverage containers  
Does not include broken glass, drinking glasses, Pyrex, light bulbs, window glass, ceramics

##### **Plastic Tubs, Bottles & Jugs**

Includes all plastic containers, e.g. plastic pop bottles, yogourt or margarine tubs, water and windshield washer jugs, shampoo, dish soap and bleach bottles.  
Does not include containers from hazardous or petroleum products such as motor oil containers.

##### **Gable-Topped Containers**

Includes 'polycoated' paper dairy, juice and molasses containers.

##### **Drinking Boxes**

Includes clean juice, milk or other 'Tetra-Pak' type drinking boxes.

##### **Newspapers, Magazines & Phone Books**

Includes inserts from newspapers and magazines, phone books, etc.

##### **Soft-Cover Books**

Includes bound catalogues and paperback books.

##### **Mixed Paper**

Includes household and office paper, 'junk' mail, fax paper, envelopes, etc.

##### **Film Plastic**

Includes plastic milk, shopping and dry cleaning bags, wrap from toilet paper and paper towels and bags from frozen foods

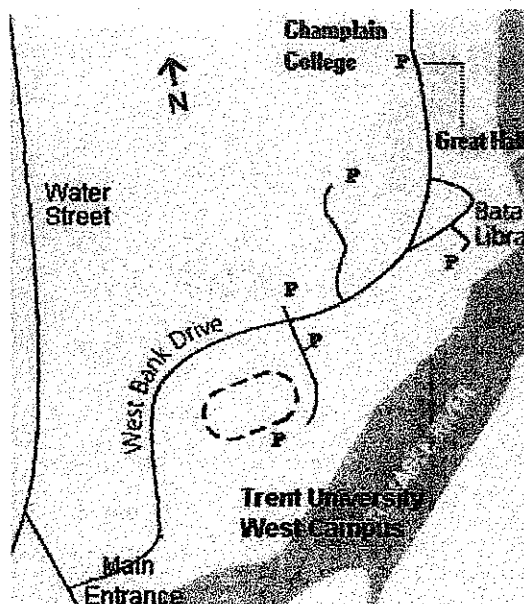

Anishinabek Police Service Curve Lake Detachment

The Police Beat is published on a monthly basis. This is to give community members a little insight as to what is happening with the local Anishinabek Police Service Curve Lake Detachment. It was requested by the local Police Committee, who received this suggestion from community members. We name adult criminal offenders but not young offenders. We don't name offenders of Provincial Statutes offences, however do include the statistics, such as traffic, insurance etc.. All of the Adult Criminal Offences information is public information and can be seen in the Peterborough This Week Court Docket.

## Consumer Identity Theft Checklist

### WATCH your IDENTITY!

Identity (ID) theft is serious. It occurs when someone steals your personal information to commit a crime. While you can't entirely control whether you will become a victim there are ways to minimize the risk.

### Guard Your Personal Information

Never give personal information by phone, Internet or mail unless you initiate the contact.

Be careful about sharing personal information and don't give out more than you need to.

**Shield** your PIN, and never lend cards. **Immediately** report missing credit or debit cards.

**Carry** only the ID you need. **Put** other ID documents (SIN, birth certificate, passport) in a safe place.

**Shred** documents with personal information.

**SIN** is only for employment and tax reporting.

Ask about the security of your information at work, with businesses and charities.

### Guard your Computer and its Information

Select a complex password of letters, numbers and symbols. Install firewall, anti-virus, anti-spyware and security software-update often.

Don't try, don't buy and don't reply to spam or emails that ask for banking information.

For online transactions, look for https://, a closed lock or an unbroken key icon.

When disposing of hard drives, use overwrite software or destroy the drive.

### ARE YOU a VICTIM?

With your identity, thieves can open new bank accounts, order cell phones, take out a mortgage on your property and buy cars or furniture.

### Signs of ID Theft

- Purchases not made by you appear on your monthly bills.
- Bills arrive on accounts you don't own.
- Collection agency calls abc unknown debt.
- Credit card/bank statements don't arrive.
- Your credit report shows mystery debts.

To replace ID cards like health, driver's licence, SIN call 1-800 O Canada

Contact Canada Post if your mail is missing.

Keep records of steps taken to clear your name and re-establish your credit.

**CAPALBO, Nicole** age 30 was charged on May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2006 with Fraud. Appeared in court on February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2007 and received 1 year Probation, 40 Hours of Community Service and ordered to pay Restitution in the amount of \$818.00.

**COPPAWAY, Bradley** age 20 was charged on August 29<sup>th</sup>, 2006 with Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle and Careless Driving. His next appearance in court is on March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2007.

**JACOBS, Coleman E.** age 26 was charged on December 30, 2006 with Assault Cause Bodily Harm. His next appearance in court is on March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2007.

**JACOBS, Jason O.** age 28 was charged on December 30, 2006 with Assault Cause Bodily Harm. His next court appearance is on March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2007.

**KNOTT, Roderick J.** age 49 was charged on April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2005 with Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking, and Two counts of Trafficking. He appeared in court on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 and received 6 Months Conditional Sentence Order (House Arrest), 1 Year Probation and a 10 year Weapons Prohibition.

**McCUE, Wendell** age 36 was charged on May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2006 with Assault, Mischief and Uttering Threats. His next appearance in court is on March 28, 2007 for Sentencing.

**TAYLOR, David S.** age 21 was charged on September 24, 2006 with Mischief. His next appearance in Court is on March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2007.
