MEMBERS NEEDED

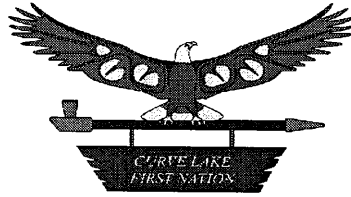
Curve Lake First Nation is designated by the Anishnabek-Union of Ontario Indians as the “Keepers of the Rock”. A committee has been formed to fulfill this responsibility. This committee is dedicated to the care and proper use of the Petroglyph site. We are in the process of defining the traditional use of the park in addition to who may be allowed on the rock itself. We need Curve Lake residents who are dedicated to the protection of this park, in order to direct the MNR in the care taking of this site.

Meetings are held quarterly however, more meetings may be required in the interim until the guidelines are finished. The first meeting is February 28, 2006 at 10. a.m. in the Council Chambers.

Under the authority of the Curve Lake First Nation Chief and Council, applications are now being accepted from members of Curve Lake First Nation for the following contract full-time position with possibility of leading to a permanent position:

PRINCIPAL / SPECIAL EDUCATION RESOURCE TEACHER

Curve Lake First Nation School

This position involves dealings in the following areas: staff management, curriculum development, school organization, community relations, student behaviour, equipment maintenance, capital, school supplies, resource materials and other areas in discussion with staff, as established by the Manager of Education. The Principal/ Special Education Resource Teacher is subject to the authority of the Curve Lake First Nation Chief and Council and will make decisions and recommendations on a daily basis to ensure that all staff carries out the education goals as established by the Education Committee, Chief and Council.

Duties:

- Providing educational leadership in the community;
- Assisting teachers with methodologies and strategies to effectively teach students;
- Leader of curriculum delivery;
- Facilitator of staff growth;
- Supervising the school program in accordance with First Nation guidelines, policies and Ministry of Education Curriculum guidelines;
- Ensuring the student's and staffs health, safety, cleanliness and comfort in the school;
- Providing written evaluations on the performance of school staff during the school year as per the performance appraisal process;
- Determining the special education needs of the school; Familiar with assessing children using a variety of standardized tests;
- Support teachers, classrooms and parents with development of IEPs and with program creation and development for exceptional students.;
- Solid understanding of early literacy, including running records (ie. PM Benchmarks)
- Effectively communicate with parents, teachers, staff and students regarding student progress and/ or areas of need
- Liaising with agencies external to the school.

- In consultation with the Education Committee, defining and implementing supervision of the school standards, program objective, with respect to staff and students as required to maintain good order, harmony and efficient operation of the school;
- Administering fair disciplinary measures, as required, which are consistent with First Nation policies;
- Reporting to the Manager of Education on issues of maintenance, busing, attendance, counselling, performance, curriculum development, discipline, and any other matters requiring action;
- All other duties as assigned by the Manager of Education;

Qualifications:

Basic Requirements: (Applications must show necessary proof with application or will be automatically screened out)

Education: The Principal's Qualification Program (Part I and II); and/or Native Principal Certificate; and/ or Masters of Education Special Ed. Part One and Two Qualifications (Part Three is an asset); or plans to commence the achievement of both Principal's Qualifications and Special Education certifications within a year.

Experience: Leadership experience in a school environment.
Classroom teaching experience.

Rated Requirements: (Will be rated in the assessment of the resume and during the interview.)

Knowledge:

Knowledge of the components of a successful and meaningful Primary program according to the Ministry of Ontario Curriculum Guidelines and First Nation expectations.
Familiarity with the Education Act and Regulations, Ministry of Education and School policies and procedures, and other matters as they have an impact on school operations and the principal's role.

Understanding of current research and best practices within the field.

Abilities:

Ability to plan, implement and evaluate the success of the classroom programs.

Ability to evaluate the progress and achievement of the students.

Ability to work in group settings.

Familiar with assessing children using a variety of standardized tests

Ability to support teachers, classrooms and parents with development of IEPs and with program creation and development for exceptional students.

Solid understanding of early literacy, including running records (ie. PM Benchmarks)

Ability to effectively communicate with the public

Abilities (continued):

Ability to identify areas where change is required and to initiate and implement change.
Excellent behavior management skills.
Excellent organizational, communication skills and willing to work as a team player.
An appreciation of the Anishnaabe language is required.
Working ability in the Anishnaabe language would be an asset.

Personal Suitability

Strong appreciation of, and empathy with, the needs of children.
Exhibits a high degree of initiative and self-direction.
Must enjoy working and being with children; requires a good sense of humour, good health, and sensitivity to native culture and issues.

Salary:

Commensurate with experience.

Length of contract:

One twelve month contract to begin August 2006 with possibility of extension.

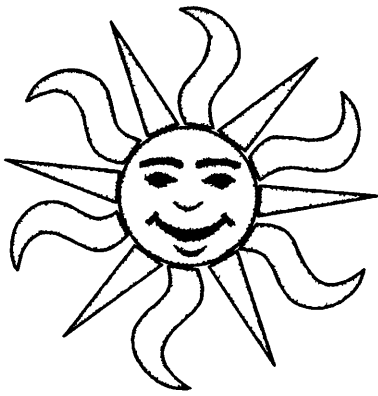

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

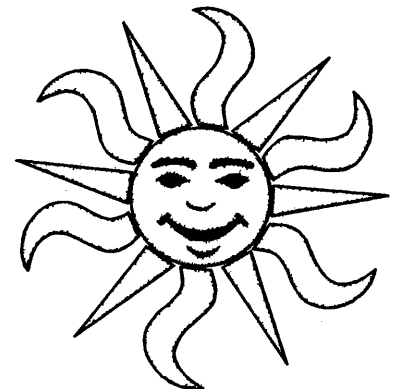
**** You must have a SIN number.** If you are in the process of applying, a birth certificate is required. Service Canada **does not accept** a birth registration card, it must be the birth certificate.
